Transparency Serbia - List of donors and other sources of income

Transparency Serbia since its establishment in 2002, has been funded mainly by donations from international and foreign organizations (including donations for regional projects received from the Transparency International Secretariat).

In some years, as one of the smallest percentages of income, we also used funds from the state budget (within the support of the Office for Cooperation with Civil Society of the Government of the Republic of Serbia and in the open calls for proposals of the Anti-Corruption Agency).

In accordance with the 2009 Law, associations may, under certain conditions, carry on business or other activities. In addition to legal requirements, Transparency Serbia has also set its own limits for accepting such jobs.

Transparency Serbia is independent of donor organizations in accordance with the organization's <u>Code of Ethics</u>, which allows only acceptance of donations that will not compromise our ability to deal with issues of public interest freely, thoroughly and objectively. Also, so far we have not been in a situation of dependency on a single donor.
